1	Health centre	Patient referred to Ely cost him twenty pounds in taxi fares. Practice manager feedback on clinics provide information but organisers can withdraw, causing patients to be referred elsewhere. Dial a ride service to be provided for patients? 2	Friars place	Derelict land opposite garage. Fly tipping and rats. Needs clearing
		The land was cleared by the local residents. It was examined on the Action Day and found to be clear. Additional areas around Upton Place were also cleared on the action day.
3	Parsons lane	Parking blocking exit from residents property at 98 Parsons lane. Large vans and other vehicles from new developments down the road.
		A letter is being drafted by Planning and Legal services at ECDC to go to the resident. Summary is that the residents request for a dropped kerb onto the road is unable to be granted for planning and legal reasons.
4	Woodfen road/Gilbertroad	Parking update. Funding to improve public open space is in place. Residents to receive letter seeking options around secure parking at drives or public open space otherwise protected.
		All of the affected residents have now been sent a letter asking whether they wish to join the scheme through a licence agreement.

In the absence of a quorate elected member forum in East Cambridgeshire to determine these objections, coupled with the ongoing work by officers to develop a practical alternative, it has not been feasible to progress the introduction of traffic management improvements in Littleport. East Cambridgeshire Local Policing Team – Action Updates:

Priorities:

1 - Speeding	throughout the panel area including evening enforcement
Objective	To reduce the amount of vehicles speeding in Littleport
Action Taken	Impact Team officers have not been in a position to conduct routine speed enforcement during this period, and there has been limited time since the last panel meeting (15/02/13 – 26/02/13) to try and deliver against this priority. Speedwatch activity in Ely Road, Lynn Road and Wisbech Road, has resulted in 1439 vehicles being monitored in Littleport over the period. This resulted in 126 letters being sent out to the drivers of speeding vehicles.
Current Situation	Speeding remains an issue in Littleport, and this is something the Police would like to continue to prioritise.

Priority 2 – 0 Ambulance s	bstructive parking at bends and junctions. Emergency vehicle access checks (include Fire and Rescue and ervice)
Objective	To reduce the amount of vehicles parking illegally or causing an obstruction, particularly in those areas highlighted by local residents.
Action Taken	Patrols have taken place in areas identified as having parking issues, and enforcement action taken where appropriate. A Day of Action took place in Littleport on 19/02/13, which included parking enforcement patrols across Littleport. A partnership project involving Littleport Community Primary School continues to try and educate parents regarding the dangers of irresponsible parking in the vicinity of the school, and a winning poster, designed by a student, has been chosen for a banner
	Since 16 Fixed Penalty Tickets have been issued for parking offences in the following locations: Granby Street, Main Street, West Fen Road, Globe Lane, Hitches Street, Crown Lane, Parsons Lane, Woodfen Road and Victoria Street. Two vehicles have also been reported for having no road tax.
Current Situation	Parking remains a concern for residents in Littleport, especially in the area of the schools.
