

(*) The Council's external auditors are required to give an opinion on the financial statements and this opinion should be "unqualified". Where the opinion is qualified each qualification identifies an area where the financial statements are unreliable. The council's audit has now been completed and an unqualified opinion has been given. Some statistics for 2010/11 were not available at the date of production of this summarised statement (marked "n/a").

Capital Expenditure in 2010/11

Capital expenditure generally represents money spent by the Council on purchasing, upgrading and improving assets such as vehicles and buildings, or giving grants to third parties for these purposes. The distinction from revenue expenditure is that the Council or the grant recipient receives the benefit from capital expenditure over a longer period of time. The Council spent just over £1.9 million on capital projects during the year, which were financed from Central Government grants, revenue contributions and receipts from the sale of assets.

Statement from the Head of Finance

The following statement by the Head of Finance describes some of the key points from the Council's stewardship of public funds.

The Council budgeted to make a planned contribution of £139,407 to the General Fund reserve at the end of 2010/11. The year end position enabled a further £37,763 to be added to this reserve. The Council's reserve balance as at 31/3/11 therefore totalled £1,623,847, which means the Council is now in a stronger financial position than it was a year ago when this balance was £1,446,677.

The Council's Statement of Accounts has been prepared in accordance with the Accounting Code of Practice. The figures in this summary were originally compiled having regard to proper accounting practice. However, for the purposes of this statement some modifications were made to provide more meaningful information.

The Council's 2010/11 accounts have been audited by an auditor appointed by the Audit Commission. The auditor published an unqualified opinion at the end of September 2011.
